RE the decision to split Trinity Ward in Stroud away from Stroud Central and to place it into the Bisley and Painswick Division. I feel this proposal could have

I was born in Stroud and grew up in Paganhill attending Callowell and Stroud Girls High. I have lived in the Horns Road area for the last 20 years.

I am strongly opposed to this proposal because Trinity is an intrinsic part of Stroud Town with numerous key buildings and facilities that make it part of the town.

One of my objections is that the proposal will literally split a road in half, Bisley Rd, with the Trinity part going into the Bisley and Painswick Division whilst the other side of the road in Slad Ward, remaining in Stroud Central.

Another major concern would be the practical management of the services and amenities in our ward. Which provide essential services for all the residents of the Stroud area. These Include the Stroud hospital and MIU, Weavers Croft, the Maternity Hospital, Trinity Church and The Trinity Rooms as well as Schools, the parks and playgrounds and the cemetery. Under these proposals their maintenance and management would fall to the responsibility of the Bisley and Painswick Ward. I feel that extracting this area from the rest of town will impact on the cohesion of service provision.

Residents of the Trinity ward feel part of Stroud town area and as such have no relationship to the mainly rural areas of Bisley and Painswick. In addition, The demographic and lifestyles of the Stroud area differ from those of Painswick and Bisley. Our different local needs are understood and well currently well catered for by Stroud's Town Council.

I strongly feel that these proposals are not in the interest of local residents of neither Trinity Ward nor Stroud. I believe we should remain in the current format as "Old Stroud" in the Trinity Ward.
