The table also shows the electoral variances for each of the proposed wards which tells you how we have delivered electoral equality. Finally, the table includes electorate projections for 2029 so you can see the impact of the recommendations for the future.

Final Recommendations on the new electoral arrangements



Who we are

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament.
- We are not part of government or any political party.
- We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.
- Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors representing the council's electors ('council size').
- The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each ward or division.

Why Coventry?

- The Commission has a legal duty to carry out an electoral review of each council in England 'from time to time'.
- Coventry City Council has not been reviewed since 2003 and the Commission has therefore decided that it should review Coventry in advance of the elections in 2026.

Our proposals

- Coventry City Council currently has 54 councillors.
 Based on the evidence we received, we recommend that 54 councillors should serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
 - 1. Deliver electoral equality for electors
 - 2. Reflect community interests and identities
- 3. Promote effective and convenient local government

Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all of the submissions received during that phase of consultation and have decided that the boundaries of most wards should change.

The final recommendations propose that Coventry should have 54 councillors, the same as there are now.

Coventry should have 18 wards, the same as there are now.

The 54 councillors should represent 18 three-councillor wards across the city.


