Put simply the council need to stop creating more boundaries and stop appointing yet more councillors (which rarely listen to the people anyway), and do something about the huge expansion of housing developments in the area.

Already I have seen the issues this creates with my own experiences. My partners twin girls were bullied at Ibstock Community College. She took them out and decided to home educate them. As they are teenagers and easily distracted, they did not take to it very well and had little self control. My partner finally decided to send them back to school. We live in Measham. The closest school the council could get them into was Heath Lane Academy in Earl Shilton.

As the council/education authority have more than likely put aside places for the new builds going up in Ashby, like Money Hill, to name just one, the twins are now taxed at the councils expense to a school outside of the catchment.

If the council are simply just rubber stamping houses on what was green belt land without any consideration to build more schools, surgeries etc, then you have failed the public that put you there in the first place.

The council MUST work with these very wealthy developers to ensure that (even before their first brick is laid, or land survey has taken place) there will be enough school places for everyone. If they can't or won't contribute to build new schools and surgeries, then the development should NOT be allowed to go ahead.

This has happened because of 1. Greed and 2. Because the government have set targets for new housing rather than deal with migration (illegal or otherwise) at source.

Why is this so difficult for you to get right and represent and work for the people who voted for you to be there in the first place.
