## Comment text:

A couple of points regarding the border between South Milford and Sherburn in Elmet.

1. The existing northern boundary of South Milford runs along the course of a stream (Mill Dyke), which crosses the South Milford/Sherburn Road at a point approx 100 mtrs south of the Leeds/Selby railway bridge which is located just to the east of the station named 'South Milford', (which is actually in Sherburn). There is no distinguishing landmark which would indicate why this boundary arrangement exists (and the development of South Milford extends seamlessly across the boundary), and when I was Chair of South Milford Parish Council I did in fact write to Sherburn Parish Council (now referred to as a Town Council for some reason or other), suggesting we moved the boundary, but to no avail. Hopefully your current project can consider the change and locate the boundary so as to be more appropriate to the circumstances.
2. It maybe outside of your remit, but it's worth saying that the new system of replacing/removing District Councils has the effect of removing a tier of local democracy, which is demeaned accordingly.
