To who it may concern,

I was shocked and disappointed to read of the proposed changes in connection with the Olton ward boundary commission, and particularly of the elitist comments from the Conservative councillors on crossing the canal on Lincoln Road North. These comments are uninformed and completely subjective. The roads under review have objectively always been part of, and connected to Olton, and are far closer to the facilities and amenities in central Olton to those in Lyndon.

In the past, my family and I have considered moving, but have chosen to remain chiefly because of the community centred around the school and church.

Whilst I appreciate the opportunity to comment as part of this consultation period, it is deeply worrying and undemocratic that plans have already advanced, and that the proposed changes were not well advertised – many of my neighbours are completely oblivious to the proposals, and I would have not been made aware if Liberal Democrat councillors had not written.
